It measures 40 metres by 18 metres by 9 metres, and weighs 18,000 tons. It is North America's largest glacial erratic. Big Rock is the biggest among thousands in a 644 km chain called the Foothills Erratic Train. Okotoks, which is derived from the Blackfoot word "Okatoks", which means "rock".</p>

INVITED MEMBERS	All members who meet eligibility requirements according to this document and anyone invited by Gymnastics Canada.
EVENT FORMAT	<p>Purpose:</p> <p>The purpose is to identify Senior, Youth and Age Group athletes for the competitive year and to rank athletes as part of the system to have access to National team status and Sport Canada Athlete Assistance Program (AAP Carding- Trampoline).</p>
ELIGIBILITY	<p><u>ATHLETES</u></p> <p>National level athletes in Trampoline (Individual and Synchronized), Tumbling, and/or Double Mini Trampoline who are in good standing with their Provincial/Territorial Federation/Association are eligible to register.</p> <p><u>COACHES</u></p> <p>All registered coaches must be certified NCCP Level 2 in Trampoline in order to coach Trampoline or Double Mini Trampoline. Coaches registered to coach in Tumbling</p>

must be certified NCCP Level 2 in either Trampoline or Artistic Gymnastics. A one-time exemption may be requested in writing from the Trampoline Program Director. A coach who is employed on a full-time basis by an organization based outside Canada is exempted from this requirement.

<p>REGISTRATION</p>	<p>Registration Fee Athletes: \$90 (\$15 per additional discipline) Coaches: \$75</p> <p>REGISTRATION AND PAYMENT WILL ONLY BE ACCPETED FROM THE CLUB.</p> <p>The waiver and medical forms (attached) must also be completed for every registered participant (athletes and coaches)</p> <p>Deadline: July 8th, 2009</p> <p>The registration form (attached), waiver and medical forms, along with the payment must be RECEIVED at the National Office (GCG) by the deadline. The registration forms must be sent via email to the attention of Denise Gauthier at dgauthier@gymcan.org.</p> <p>A hard copy of the registration must accompany the waiver and medical forms and payment submitted by the club. Payment can be made by cheque, payable to "Gymnastics Canada Gymnastique", or by credit card by completing the credit card information section on the registration form under "financial info". A 6 percent transaction fee applies for credit card payment. All documents and payment MUST be sent to the attention of Denise Gauthier at GCG.</p> <p>All forms must be duly and fully completed. Incomplete forms (i.e. missing birthday, NCCP numbers, missing or incomplete medical and/or waiver forms, etc.) will be charged a penalty fee of \$20 per registered participant.</p> <p>Written request for refund can be made to the attention of Denise Gauthier (GCG) until July 13th, 2009. After this date, there will be NO reimbursement of the registration fee.</p> <p>A participant not registered by the deadline may be authorized to compete upon payment of the registration fee plus a \$50.00 penalty per registered participant (athlete and coaches). No registration is accepted if received at the National Office less than ten days before the first day of competition.</p> <p>No registration will be accepted if received at the National Office after July 17, 2009 unless special dispensation is given by the T&T Program Director. Late entries will replace athletes who withdraw after the draw is done.</p>

<p>EVENT TRANSPORTATION</p>	<p>Teams will fly into the Calgary International Airport and must arrange for their own transportation to the accommodations and venue. The distance to the accommodations from the Airport is 29 Km, while the distance from the accommodations to the venue is 30 Km.</p>
